Thoughts:

Isn't it always IN THE CHAOS that hope finds a way into our broken hearts? We would never even notice LIGHT slowly dawning on us and giving us a reason to hope, if we did not feel lost in darkness and confusion. Surely this entire year we've just said goodbye to, and the most recent weeks in our nation have given us stronger reasons to be anxious, bewildered, doubtful and very very sad. So many songs have been written about just this state of mind: songs about hitting rock bottom and realizing the only way out is UP!! "a dead end street is just a place to turn around..."

Surely pandemic fear and restrictions, loss of loved ones, isolation, seeing the images of our nation's Capitol assaulted are enough to send us to the rock hard bottom of our hearts. St Peter proclaims in his first letter, chapter 3, verse 15, "Always be ready to give an answer to anyone who asks you about the hope you

have. Be ready to give the reason for it. But do it gently and with respect."
