

Necrology of SISTER JEANNE-D'ARC POIRIER

(Sister Jeanne-d'Arc-Marie)

1922 – 2021

Many refer to July 25th as Christmas in July. Thus it was for the Poirier family in 1922 as God gifted them with their second daughter. Her parents, Louis Poirier and Leona (Cotnoir) Poirier, were grateful for such a gift. The next day at Notre Dame in Southbridge, Rose Jeanne-d'Arc became a child of God. Their first daughter, Helene, was already a few years old. Later, Leo and Theresa would complete the happy family. The bond forged early on and strengthened throughout their lives, was one of deep affection for and attention to one another. The family enjoyed life among the numerous Franco-American families living in Southbridge. The American Optical, often referred to as the AOEyeware, had opened in 1869. Many inhabitants from Quebec looking for work established themselves in Southbridge, MA.

The general atmosphere within the Poirier family was one of joy and thoughtfulness. As a solid Catholic family, the evening prayer and the rosary were recited after supper. All attended the Marian devotions during the months of May and October as well as the Novena to Sainte Anne in July. Only illness excused anyone from attending.

Jeanne-d'Arc's father was born in Taunton, MA, and moved to Southbridge in his early years. On a trip to Quebec he met a woman from St. Robert, comptée Richelieu. She would soon become his wife. Married in St. Robert, they immediately established themselves in Southbridge, MA. Mr. Poirier, a cheerful man, loved to sing from La Bonne Chanson, work outside, garden and take long walks for relaxation. He supported his family by working at the AO that employed more than two thousand workers.

To meet Jeanne-d'Arc's mother would be to converse with a tall, gracious and educated lady. Before her marriage, she was a French teacher in a private school in Sorel, PQ. Thus, the education of her children was vital. Mrs. Poirier was also an excellent cook, a good seamstress and a meticulous housekeeper. Later in life, she did substitute teaching at Notre Dame School.

Jeanne-d'Arc attended Notre Dame School from grades one through eight, and Notre Dame Academy from grades nine through twelve. She was a docile and receptive child who admired the devotion of the Sisters of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin. She already desired to follow in their footsteps. Upon finishing high school, Jeanne-d'Arc worked as a secretary at the AO for a few years. She then fulfilled the desire so long carried in her heart.

In the winter of 1944, Jeanne-d'Arc travelled to Nicolet, Quebec to become a Sister of the Assumption of the B.V. She was following her older sister, Helene, who had already professed her vows within the Congregation. Being the only American to enter at that time, Jeanne-d'Arc feared feeling out of place in a setting unfamiliar to her. As soon as she experienced the charitable hospitality of her Canadian sisters, her worries were dispelled.

After pronouncing her vows in 1946, and beginning her ministry as an educator, her lifelong dream became a reality. In Salem, MA, the school community was the first to experience her loving and kind presence. Her aim was to exemplify the love of Jesus and guide young hearts to believe in her caring and tender God. Throughout her nearly five decades as a teacher, principal or superior,

Sister Jeanne-d'Arc not only radiated a kindness that attracted many, but also inspired them to imitate her goodness. Such was her influence that many kept in contact with her well into her senior years. She trustingly accepted many responsibilities and diligently accomplished her duties. Many admired her gracious hospitality, her radiant smile and her acceptance of each one as a unique child of God.

Early in her seventies, Sister Jeanne-d'Arc's eyesight was diminishing and becoming progressively worse. In spite of this difficulty, she never complained and simply used stronger light and magnifying glasses. It was at that time that she assumed the leadership role among the elderly sisters in Petersham Always ready to serve, Sister Jeanne-d'Arc's compassion, discretion and prayerfulness enriched the lives of her sisters. Her sense of humor and sound judgment also enhanced their lives. Simplicity, availability, attentiveness to others and to detail, and a total giving of self best characterized the life of Sister Jeanne-d'Arc.

The last ten years of Sister Jeanne d'Arc's life were joyfully lived in Marlborough among the Sisters of Ste. Chrétienne whom she dearly loved. She was a cherished member of their community.

Sister Jeanne d'Arc welcomed the New Year with Hope. With that prayer in her heart, she went to meet her God a few hours later to deliver this plea personally.

Sister Jeanne d'Arc, your lifelong admiration of all things beautiful has grown due to your deep prayer life and your complete trust in the One you love. Today, you are enjoying the fullness of God's marvelous creation: sunrises, sunsets, stars, oceans with lighthouses, mountains, flowers, fall colors, the new fallen snow, rainbows. May you receive the reward you so richly deserve for a life of simplicity and of service. May the loving God so real to you throughout your life embrace you eternally.
